Day to day affairs of running the College are being managed by the Principal assisted by appropriate staff under overall supervision of the College Committee comprising of 3 or 4 representatives of the Trust, the Principal and a representative of the teaching and non-teaching staff. The College Building is spacious with all modern facilities and is designed to accommodate students from Std. I up to Std. XII with a seating capacity of 7,200 students working in two shifts. The motto of the College reads "धिद्या धिनयेन शोभते" which means "MODESTY ADORNS KNOWLEDGE."

The College does not receive any Grant – in – Aid from the Government and the only source of income is the amount of fees collected from the students.

The Trust holds exemption u/s 80G of the Income Tax Act and is registered with the Charity Commissioner under Registration No. E8297 (BOM) dated 17-8-1981 as a Public Charitable Trust with the object to establish and / or run educational institutions.

Any constructive suggestion from the parents whose children are being admitted to the College shall always be welcome. The Trust Office is housed in the Yashodham High School Building, Goregaon (E), Mumbai – 400 063, where such constructive suggestions can be recorded with the Trustee – in – charge.

Parent-Teacher Association has been established on 16.12.1997 vide circular from School Education Department of Government of Maharashtra. Each parent shall be a member of the PTA.

The achievements of an organization are the results of the combined effort of each individual.

COLLEGE INFORMATION

- VASANT VIHAR HIGH SCHOOL & JUNIOR COLLEGE was founded on 02-07-1990. The
 medium of instruction is English. Presently, the classes are conducted for Primary (Std. I to
 Std. IV), Secondary (Std. V to Std. X) and Junior College(Std. XI and Std. XII). The
 Institution is recognized on permanently unaided basis. Junior College Section started in
 the year 2002.
- 2. The college prepares students of Classes Grade XI for the examinations conducted by the Indian School Certificate and class XII for the Higher Secondary Certificate Examination (H.S.C.) conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.
- 3. The academic year of the College begins in April.
- 4. The College has well-equipped Libraries, Science Labs, Auditorium, Computer Laboratories and Audio-Visual rooms with latest equipment's and offers Computer Education for Primary, Secondary & Junior College Sections.
- 5. Physical training and outdoor games are compulsory (unless a doctor's certificate is produced)
- 6. Admissions of children to the College is open to all, irrespective of caste, creed, religion and sex.
- 7. Should the Parent / Guardian feel that his / her child is not making the desired progress, the Principal should be contacted for guidance. **OUR TEACHERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO OFFER PRIVATE TUITIONS**. The Parents are advised to refrain from engaging teachers either from the College or from outside for coaching, as such tuitions normally do more harm than good.
- 8. The College premises is under CCTV surveillance.

ADMISSIONS / WITHDRAWALS

- 1. Parents seeking admission for their ward in Std. XI will have to follow admission procedure prescribed by CISCE.
- 2. On being granted admission, the parent / guardian will have to fill in the Admission Form and submit the necessary certificates.
- 3. A child coming from a recognized school / college will be admitted only when a School / College Leaving Certificate from the school / college he / she has last attended, is produced. The School / College Leaving Certificate or Transfer Certificate should bear the recognition number of that school/ college, Saral Id No. of the student and UDISE No.
- All withdrawals from the college can be made only on the written request for the same giving one calendar months' notice or paying fees equivalent to one month in lieu of the notice period by the parent / guardian of the child to the Principal. Application for a leaving certificate, should be made by the parent / guardian on the prescribed form provided in the College Handbook. Signatures of both the parents, is mandatory on the application form.
- 5. In case of request for a duplicate of the College Leaving Certificate, the parent / guardian, will have to produce an affidavit stating therein what has happened to the original certificate and why a duplicate College Leaving Certificate is needed. A nominal fee will be charged for obtaining a duplicate College Leaving Certificate.
- 6. In case of adopted child, a certified copy of adoption document is to be submitted at the time of admission.
- 7. In all matters regarding admission, Principal's decision shall be final and binding on parents.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

WEARING OF CLEAN AND WELL IRONED UNIFORM ALONG WITH IDENTITY CARD IS COMPULSORY FOR STUDENTS.

FOR GIRLS: Sky blue T-Shirt with white open collar and three buttons, Navy blue coloured track pants.

FOR BOYS: Sky blue T-Shirt with white open collar and three buttons, Navy blue coloured track pants.

SHOES: Black shoes with laces (All season)

Wearing any of the following is not permissible:

- i. Cosmetics of any type
- ii. Nail paint
- iii. Coloured eye contact lenses
- iv. Hair colour
- v. Jewellery
- vi. Expensive wrist watch

No fancy hair cut is allowed

General Instructions:

Wearing of clean and well-ironed uniform is compulsory for students. Any student who comes to college without proper uniform or whose appearance is untidy continuously, is liable to be sent home. The college accepts no responsibility if, for failure of wearing college uniform or wearing it untidy, the pupil is sent back home during class hours.

UNIFORM OTHER THAN THE PATTERN RECOMMENDED BY THE COLLEGE WILL NOT BE PERMITTED.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

CHECKLIST FOR A SMARTLY TURNED OUT AND WELL-DISCIPLINED STUDENT

DO'S

NOTE

- 1. Incase of any foot injury, students should submit an application and a doctor's certificate and get prior permission from the Principal for wearing an appropriate footwear or for using the lift.
- 2. Any student who does not heed to the rules persistently with respect to uniform and dress code is liable to be sent home.
- 3. In order to reduce social conflict and peer pressure, the college has decided to make it mandatory for students to come to college in college uniform on all days including birthdays.

RULES REGARDING LEAVE, ABSENCE ETC

- 1. Regular Attendance is essential.
- Students must be present in the college after holidays / vacations on the re-opening day
 of the college. They must also remain present in the college on the last working day of
 the college, preceding the holidays / vacations. Such absence will be viewed seriously.
- 3. A medical certificate will have to be produced immediately in case of absence due to sickness and while resuming college after sickness, a medical fitness certificate must be submitted by the student.
- 4. A student should not remain absent from the college except in case of emergency. On the day on which he / she returns to college, the student must produce a note in the Hand Book from his / her parent / guardian stating the reason for the absence. The College accepts no responsibility in case of failure in producing this note from the parent / guardian. The student is liable to be handed over to the parent / guardian for taking back home.
- 5. If the child is ill, suffering from some contagious disease, the Principal should be informed of the same within two days by the parent / guardian, supported by a medical certificate. The child should not be sent to college till he / she is free from any danger of carrying infection. At the time of resuming college, the child must produce a medical fitness certificate.
- 6. Any student who is late in attending college should bring with him / her a written application from his / her parent / guardian for late attendance. College accepts no responsibility if he / she is sent home during class hours due to failure in producing such written application.
- 7. No student will be permitted to leave college early. No half day leave will be granted.
- 8. Attendance at official College functions, like Sports day, Independence Day, Republic Day etc. is compulsory. Corrective measures will be taken against absentees.

RULES FOR THE STUDENTS

- 1. This is an English medium college. All the students are expected to speak in English.
- 2. The college uniform and identity card must be worn every day. A student without proper uniform will be sent back.
- 3. Uniform worn should be neat and tidy, hair properly combed and shoes polished well.
- 4. Students should not wear jewellery, costly wrist watches and should not bring valuable items, mobile phones, pager etc. to college.
- 5. Books not recommended, magazines, comics etc, should not be brought to the college. No article liable to be a source of disturbance should be brought to college. Use of Mobile Phones in the college premises is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Students are expected to arrive at college before the assembly bell. Habitual late comers will be sent home after three late marks.
- 7. Any student coming late will not enter the class unless he / she brings a note to the teacher from the Vice Principal / Principal.
- 8. Students must maintain silence in the college. They must maintain discipline when moving from one class to another. They should move in a single file only.
- 9. No student will be excused from Physical Education without a Doctor's Certificate.
- 10. No collections will be made by the students unless permitted by the Principal in advance.
- 11. Students are not allowed to give presents to the teachers.
- 12. Students are not allowed to distribute sweets / presents / eatables of any kind on their birthday. Instead, they can voluntarily donate a book/s to the college library, to inculcate the good habit of reading and sharing.
- 13. Students should look after their books, clothes, pens, wrist watch, money, etc. College does not accept any responsibility for loss of such things.
- 14. Students should be regular, courteous, well-behaved, disciplined, and clean in their dress and habits.
- 15. A student who is persistently insubordinate, wilfully mischievous, guilty of misconduct and/or has unwholesome influence on fellow students is liable to be expelled from the college.
- 16. A student is responsible to the college not only for his / her behavior in the College but also for his / her general behavior outside. Every effort should be made by the student to keep up the good name of the college by his / her manners and department. Students should greet their teachers/visitors when they meet them.
- 17. Students will not take part in any political activities.
- 18. During the absence of the teacher, Monitor will be responsible for the order and discipline of the class.
- 19. It is forbidden to buy eatables from street vendors.
- 20. Students are expected to keep THE COLLEGE PREMISES CLEAN.
- 21. All students are expected to:
 - show respect to all the teachers.
 - avoid shouting, whistling, or running in the college building.
 - avoid using indecent language.
 - avoid throwing paper anywhere in and around the College premises, except in the bins provided for the purpose.
 - observe all the rules of good conduct on the streets while coming to or returning from college.

INTERNET / CYBER SAFETY

Internet is an amazing source of information, is a way to stay connected with friends and family. However, it has a flipside and comes with its share of problems. Internet safety is about children being smart about how to handle themselves online and protecting themselves from falling prey to any online scam.

STRATEGIES AT STUDENT LEVEL

Students should be encouraged -

- ❖ To take responsibility for managing their digital reputation.
- To trust each other respectfully online and offline.
- ❖ To understand the importance of protecting their password.
- ❖ To think about where they are travelling to and whether it is a safe place to spend their online time.
- ❖ To be aware that people can pretend to be anybody they want online, so it is best to have only offline friends.
- To share their experience of cyber bullying with adults.

STRATEGIES AT THE PARENT / FAMILY LEVEL

- Computers to be placed in a central place.
- Parents should be active in their child's life and should know who their friends are, both online and offline
- Parents should look out for signs of bullying such as
 - a. Loss of interest in college.
 - b. Not wanting to spend time with friends.
 - c. Anxiety around technology uses.
 - d. Being depressed.
 - e. Difficulty in sleeping.
 - f. Lower academic performance.
- Parents should keep evidence of cyber bullying.
- Parents to set up an alert on Google.
- Parent to educate their child not to leave her / his mobile phone lying around where others can use it, without permission.

IMPORTANT NOTE

- 1. Display of any disorderly conduct, doing of any act which causes or likely to cause physical / or psychological harm, raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in or outside the school, which includes abusing, threatening, or playing practical jokes or leaving and causing hurt to any student is strictly prohibited.
- 2. Asking any student to do or forcing him to do something which a student will not in the ordinary course willingly do, is also a punishable offence.
- 3. Any such disorderly act found by the Institution, will be subject to an enquiry by a committee constituted by the school.
- 4. If students involved are found to be at fault, the same will be reported to the competent authorities for necessary action.
- 5. In addition, such students are liable to be dismissed from the school. They may not be able to get admitted in any Educational Institution for a period of five years.

SAFETY MEASURES

- 1. Students should compulsorily wear the identity-card issued to them by the College along with their uniform.
- 2. Parents should always possess the identity card issued by the College when they enter the College premises.
- 3. Students should be given the following instructions, periodically and they should be alert at all times.
 - Students should not talk to strangers, accept anything in cash or kind from strangers.
 - Students should never agree to go home with strangers.
 - Students should not agree to go home even with a relative without prior confirmation from their parents.
 - Students should not talk loudly on streets or in front of strangers about any situation of their home or about the time when their parents are not at home.
 - Students should always move around in groups, especially to and from college.
- 4. Parents should explain the concept of good touch and bad touch to their children.
- 5. Parents can form car pool groups for safe transportation of children.
- 6. Parents should supervise / stay with the children when they go down to play.
- 7. Parents are advised not to send their children to college if they are unwell.
- 8. Along with the values learnt in college, it is of utmost importance to lay stress on cleanliness, hygiene and above all **a sense of responsibility.**

RULES FOR THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

1. The Library is open from: Monday to Friday: 11.30 a.m. to 6.30 p.m.

Saturday: 1.30 p.m. to 3.30 p.m.

- 2. Books will be issued for the use of the BORROWER only.
- 3. A pupil can borrow or return books once a week only.
- 4. Books should not be kept for more than a week.
- 5. Failure to return a book on the expiry of the period of a week, the pupil will be penalized (Re 5/- per day.)
- 6. Books must be kept clean and used carefully. No marking should be done in the library book. Any imperfection found in them or any damage done to them must be reported to the College Librarian before taking the book home. The damage done to books or magazines and loss of books will have to be made good by the pupil concerned.
- 7. Reference books and magazines cannot be borrowed or taken out of the Library.
- 8. Students can borrow parallel text-books of ISC syllabus.
- 9. Students must consult the Librarian / teacher for the books recommended for their specific age group and record should be maintained (Library Record)
- 10. All books must be returned in good condition before the beginning of each Terminal Examination and before a Leaving Certificate is issued. The borrower who fails to return a book must pay a fine equal to the value of the book.
- 11. No personal books, bags, satchels, electronic gadgets, and eatables are allowed in the Library. Any personal books found will be confiscated. Only note-books and a pencil may be taken in.
- 12. Every pupil should help to keep the library clean and tidy and see that the books and magazines are kept in their proper places.
- Strict silence must be observed in the library and conversation should be kept to the minimum and sound should be low.
- 14. The Library should be used <u>only</u> for pursuing reference books, parallel text books, periodicals, and reviews.
- 15. Before taking the College Leaving Certificate / Hall Ticket, every student is requested to return all Library books and get the Librarian's signature in the application for Clearance Certificate. Necessary form is provided at the end of the Hand Book.
- 16. Library will be closed on Public and National Holidays.

LABORATORIES

Facilities to use all the laboratories are available to students for Grade III onwards. All experiments will be undertaken in the presence of and with the knowledge of the teacher and the Laboratory Assistant.

Pupils are requested to take special care of the Laboratory materials and apparatus. The cost of repairs and replacements if any will be borne by the pupils concerned. No pupil is allowed in the Laboratory except during Practical Periods.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

- 1. Since this is an English medium college, every student should learn to speak and write good English. Hence at home, he / she should be given an opportunity to speak English and speak it correctly. Parents should instruct their ward that, except for Hindi / Marathi classes, English alone should be spoken during the college hours.
- 2. Parents and Guardians are reminded that without their help and co-operation not much can be achieved by the efforts made by the college to mould and improve the character of the child. They are earnestly requested to instill discipline.
- 3. Parents are earnestly requested to pursue and sign the reports of the child, or any other remarks made by the College Authorities and do the needful in the matter.
- 4. Parents should not engage college teachers as private tutors vide item 11 under College Information. We strongly discourage private tuitions. Instead, we would suggest that you inculcate in your ward the habits of self study and regularity in study. And create at home a conducive atmosphere to study. Avoid all kinds of disturbances like T.V. radio, video, Internet, etc. Let your child surf the net only for essential information under your supervision.
- 5. Parents are requested to refrain from giving any gifts to the members of the staff.
- 6. Parents are requested to refrain from celebrating their children's birthday in college in any way.
- 7. If any student is found to have done damage of any kind in class or in and about the college premises the parents / guardian will have to make good the loss. Decision of the Principal regarding the amount to be paid will be final.
- 8. Criticism of your children's teachers in the presence of children should be avoided as it encourages them to lose respect for their teachers. In case of any grievance kindly meet the Principal.
- 9. IDENTIY CARD FOR PARENTS/ GUARDIANS /SERVANTS IS A MUST FOR ENTERING THE COLLEGE PREMISES. Parents are requested to refrain from entering the college premises except for meeting the Principal or Teachers by appointment. Kindly advise servants who come to collect your wards from college, not to remain in the college premises any longer than is necessary.
- 10. Parents are advised to make it a point to attend the Open House. <u>They will not be allowed to meet the teachers without prior permission from the Principal on other working days</u>.
- 11. If your child is suffering from infectious conditions like viral fever, conjunctivitis, acute cough and cold, chicken pox etc., kindly refrain from sending him / her to college as it leads to spread of infection. All parents are advised to take this as a moral responsibility in preventing the spread of infection among students as well as staff and care givers in college.
 - Children suffering from any such infectious condition will not be allowed to attend college without producing a Fitness Certificate.

- 12. In case your child is suffering from any acute medical conditions such as: Asthma, Febrile Convulsions (Fits), Juvenile diabetes, Migraine, Depression / Psychological problems or any other, kindly keep the college authorities informed in writing about the following.
 - a. Telephone Number of Parents.
 - b. Person to be contacted immediately in case of emergency.
 - c. Medication / First Aid to be given.
 - d. Telephone number of the Doctor.
 - e. Brief medical history of the child.
- 13. Parents and guardians are requested to notify the college of any change in their address and telephone number.
- 14. There will be a penance study class for an hour for those who fail to do homework, or for any other reason that the teacher or the Principal states.

Please Note:

If the child is detained or sent back during college hours due to said reason, in that case the responsibility towards security of the child will not be that of the college.

- 15. Parents are informed that their children are liable to be sent home for any of the following reasons:
 - a. Arriving late for college
 - b. Not wearing proper uniform with IDENTITY CARD
 - c. Repeatedly forgetting to bring books. Not submitting work on time.
- N.B.: The college accepts no responsibility for the safety of pupils obliged to return home during class hours for any of the reasons mentioned above.
- 16. Parents are advised not to request for half days or leave, as project assignments and assessments will be conducted regularly. Absence will lead to irregularity in testing procedures and incompletion of day to day work.

RULES REGARDING FEES

- 1. Fees for Std.XI and Std.XII to be paid annually.
- 2. The delay of payment beyond 3 months renders a pupil liable to be struck off the roll. If the pupil is re-admitted the Admission Fee must be paid again.
- 3. If a student is to be withdrawn, one calendar months' notice should be given in writing by the Parent / Guardian to the Principal of the School in order to arrange for the refund of the balance of tuition fees. In exceptional circumstances of withdrawal, one month's tuition fee in lieu of one calendar months' notice will have to be paid. Amount collected as Term Fee or Tuition Fee will not be refunded.
 - 4. Students whose fees are not paid will be considered as defaulters.
- 5. Unless all dues are paid by the student, the results of the examinations / tests conducted by the college will not be communicated to the student. School Leaving Certificate will not be issued till all the outstanding dues from the student at the time of leaving the college are paid and clearance certificate from the concerned authority is obtained.
- 6. Students who leave the college in the month previous to any vacation must pay the fees for the vacation.
- 7. No deduction in fees will be allowed for vacations or for broken period of the month. Full month's fee will be payable if the student's name appears on the roll on the 1st day of the month. Admission fee will not be refunded even if the student, for any reason, leaves the college immediately after securing admission.
